

Executive Summary

Light of Life Trust is a non-governmental organization established in 2002 by Mrs. Villy Doctor, the Founder Trustee with a vision to transform the lives of underprivileged rural communities.

LOLT's Projects: The organization aims to empower communities through an integrated model of education, skill training for livelihood programmes & health care in rural areas.

1. **Project Anando – (Education):** initiated in 2005 with 25 children, the project supports underprivileged rural children to complete their secondary education and their all-round development. Over the years it has impacted **8244** children directly and **41220** community members indirectly across more than **480** villages.
2. **Project Jagruti (Vocational Training):** provides training to underprivileged rural women, girls & youth to help them earn and attain financial independence. **1712** persons from the village communities have benefited from these training programmes since its inception.

Project Jagruti (Healthcare): The Medical Mobile Unit is in operation since July 2013 and covers remote areas without adequate health care facilities. Over the last three years the mobile medical unit has reached out to **15586** patients.

Environmental Conservation Programme: initiated in 2015, the program focused on supporting poor farmers with an additional income through the distribution of fruit bearing plants. So far, **1590** beneficiaries from **31** villages in Raigad District have benefitted and **39170** fruit bearing plants have been distributed.

Major Highlights of the year 2015 – 16:

- Founder Trustee Mrs. Villy Doctor debuted as an Online Fundraiser, became a Change Icon & the 3rd highest fundraiser. She was felicitated by CH. Vidyasagar Rao, the Governor of Maharashtra.
- First step towards Advocacy – Mrs. Villy Doctor met with Governor of Maharashtra to present the work undertaken by LOLT over the years and post the meeting LOLT has submitted a five year proposal for School Empowerment Programme in Palghar District, Maharashtra State.
- Anando Plus beneficiaries achieving financial independence:
 - * Ms. Pooja Kate, Kinhiraja Centre, Washim District has joined the Washim Police Department as a constable.
 - * Mr. Rohit Borade, Neral Centre, Karjat Taluka has started his own coaching classes with 80 students and is heading a seven member team.
- Project Anando was initiated in the state of Madhya Pradesh in partnership with a local NGO – Kohka Foundation in Kuria Taluka, Seoni District with 125 beneficiaries.
- Project Jagruti – Environment Conservation Programme initiated in collaboration with All Cargo Logistics Ltd in Karjat & Uran Taluka with 590 farmers across 28 villages to provide additional income source to poor farmers with the plantation of fruit bearing trees.
- Lokkruti Project, Mohili Village, Karjat Taluka
 - * Vocational training programmes – Beautician Training & Health Attendant Training have been initiated.
 - * Additional facility of a shed has been provided increasing the usable space at the centre.
- Project Jagruti – Jeevan Asha Community Centre
 - * New training programmes initiated in this year
 - Health Attendant Training Course
 - Journalism Course
 - Electrician Training Course
 - * A new community centre initiated in Pokharan, Thane District in collaboration with Voltas Ltd.

- Economic Empowerment: 93% of parents earn a monthly income below ₹ 5500/- in comparison 51 % of employed beneficiaries are earning monthly income from ₹ 5500/- to ₹ 22,000/-
- Social Impact: In the areas of intervention the average marriage age of female beneficiaries of LOLT is 20.5 years as against the average age of 17 years in the said area.
- Educational Impact: 57% of LOLT female beneficiaries are pursuing higher education, in comparison 16 % of female students pursue higher education in Maharashtra.



First generation learners need support and guidance to break out of the vicious cycle of poverty & illiteracy.

Light of Life Trust, through its Project Anando, initiated in 2005, works towards uplifting underprivileged rural secondary school children by reinstating/sustaining them in schools and equipping them with skills to become independent and productive citizens. The goal is not just literacy but all round development of each child through a 3E Approach, i.e. Educate, Empower & Equip for Employability, thus empowering the beneficiaries to take life changing decisions by choosing appropriate career paths.



Project Anando: Model & 3 E Approach



The 3 E Approach

- **Educate:** Reinstatement/sustain in schools, provide supplementary education, extra-curricular activities.
- **Empower:** Meditation, Personality Development through imparting life skills.
- **Equip for Employability:** Vocational Guidance, Career Planning, Computer Training and English Language Development.

Concentrating on all round development, every child is given the requisite support.

Highlights 2015-2016:

- **Expansion of Project Anando in the state of Madhya Pradesh:**
 - In collaboration with a local NGO – Kohka Foundation in Turia Village, Kuria Taluka, Seoni District with 166 beneficiaries. The area is predominantly tribal and majority of the beneficiaries are first generation learners.
- **Kalpataru – a musical:** An Anant production scheduled for two performances in the month of April 2016 in Mumbai and Pune. 25 students under the Anant Programme have been selected for the performance and are in rehearsals currently.

In Maharashtra

- **Raigad District:**
 - Karjat Taluka

- **Washim District:**
 - All students attend supplementary education session in Washim District
- **Nandurbar District:**
 - For the first time, Nandurbar team successfully conducted the Bal Kala Mahotsav for the Anando beneficiaries and received high level of support not only from the children and parents but also from the school authorities and other education department officials. It was the first time that such a huge programme was organized for the secondary school children in Nandurbar District
 - Computer Literacy Drive in Nandurbar District during the vacations not only enhanced computer knowledge and usage amongst the beneficiaries but also halted their migration as they expressed a desire to stay back and attend the classes held during this period
 - Setting up of a Bicycle Library in Nandurbar to ensure beneficiaries living far away from school are able to attend school regularly. 110 bicycles were distributed to children residing between 3 – 5 kms distance from school. Looking at the success of the concept the District Education Officer took a decision to provide the same to all the students through Government funds.



In Madhya Pradesh

- **Seoni District:**
 - Regular supplementary education classes have improved academic results at the end of the year.
 - School authorities have provided space to set up a computer training centre for all the children.

Case Study : 1

Name of the Student : Ashish Manwar
Centre & Region : Mangrulpir, Washim
Std : X
Selection Criteria : Orphan
Problem Identified : Probable school drop out
Outcome : Ashish is continuing with his education.

Description:

Ashish lost his parents when he was very young and is being looked after by his maternal aunt. In the last few months it was observed that Ashish had stopped attending Anando classes and workshop. The school teachers also shared that he has been absent in school in the same period. Though his aunt was willing to support his education, Ashish himself was reluctant to continue with education. On discussion with Ashish, it was found that Ashish was psychologically disturbed and was emotionally insecure as he had experienced death of his dear ones very closely. He was also having anxiety owing to the fact that he did not have his own home. The LOLT team systematically undertook counselling sessions with him, inculcated positive thinking in him and motivated him. As a result, Ashish has resumed school and is trying to focus on his studies under the guidance and continuous support of the team and is preparing to appear for his Std X exams.

Case Study : 2

Name of the Student : Rina Gaikwad
Centre & Region : Nehuli, Alibaug
Std : VIII
Selection Criteria : Single Parent
Problem Identified : Probable school drop out
Outcome : Rina is continuing with her education.

Description:

Rina is a single parent child. Her father expired due to a chronic disease when Rina was very young. Rina's elder sister committed suicide after her marriage. Her mother is a laborer and works on daily wages. Rina was enrolled in Anando Project in September 2015 owing to her vulnerable background. However, she stopped attending Anando activities after a month's time and also stopped attending school. The Anando team worked on a systematic plan of action. Several home visits were undertaken and counselling sessions were conducted. Rina's mother was made to understand emotional insecurity and anxiety of her daughter. Efforts were directed to create emotional support for Rina from her mother. This plan worked well and Rina finally resumed school and in trying to focus on her studies under the guidance and continuous support of Anando Team.

Anant Programme

Anant initiated in 2008 is a collaborative Arts education programme between **Flowering Tree Inc., USA** and Light of Life Trust. A unique programme, it provides a platform for students to develop skills and experience in the performing arts. Dedicated music and dance teachers, along with social worker staff form a strong dual pronged team, that nurtures and guides students to overcome the challenges to their aspirations. It inculcates amongst the students discipline, self-confidence, freedom of self-expression and the ability to work with others towards a finite goal. Practice, preparation & polishing of performances is a traditional time tested format for observation of self & others. Anant develops skillful, empathic, and engaged young people ready to meet the challenges and joys of life.

Kalpataru – a musical

The Anant programme has so far successfully trained & mentored more than 300 Anando beneficiaries in three musical components – Indian vocal, tabla & folk dance. Beneficiaries coming from underprivileged communities who never thought of learning music have blossomed in the field of music over the last 8 years and in this year it was decided that it was the appropriate time to show case their development to the world through the production of ‘KALPATARU’ - a musical drama performed by them .Two shows have been planned in Mumbai & Pune on 23rd & 24th April 2016 respectively.

The script is based on the famous story ‘The Flowering Tree’ and is written & choreographed by the Srijon Foundation team lead by its Founder Ms. Kamalika Guha Thakurta - a well-known theatre personality, dancer & a T. V. actor.



25 Anant beneficiaries have been shortlisted for the production. Rehearsals began from the month of November 2015 at the Jeevan Asha Community Centre in Karjat.

Success Story # 1

Name : Gayatri Nandakumar Aamle
Music Component : Vocal
Joined Anant : 2008

Gayatri was enrolled as an Anando beneficiary owing to the poor economic conditions of her family. Her home environment was not conducive for her growth as there were continuous domestic quarrels between her parents making her emotionally insecure. She was selected as an Anant beneficiary taking into consideration her inherent skills in singing and the thought that music therapy would help her to deal with her life situations better. She has now become a well - trained singer and is a local famous artist too. She performs under various local orchestra banners. She has successfully completed 3 exams of Sugam Sangeet, has also cleared her 1st exam of Gandharva Mahavidyalaya and is now appearing for the 2nd exam post which she will become a 'Visharad'. Jeevan Asha Community Centre in Pokharan, Thane District

In partnership with Voltas Ltd, in the month of February 2016, the Light of Life Trust initiated work in the Pokharan area of Thane District in the urban slums – Subhash Nagar, Gandhi Nagar, Sainath Nagar & Bhim Nagar with an aim to provide services to the local community in the areas of education, livelihood training, healthcare & sanitation. A need assessment of the area was undertaken to ensure that appropriate services could be provided.



The first programme conducted for the community was on Women's Day – 6th March 2016 which was celebrated at the Navjeevan Vidyalaya School Hall. The School Principal Mr. Jitendra Bajaj & teachers participated in the programme where **26 women from Gandhi Nagar were present**. A rose was given to the women and school staff as a welcome gift. The LOLT team shared the vision and mission of the organization and the plan of the community centre initiated with support from Voltas Ltd. A number of fun activities were organized for the women along with a brief session on good practices of cooking food and the importance of providing nutritional food to the family. Young Mentor Programme

Light of Life Trust in collaboration with Rosy Blue Foundation formally introduced the Young Mentor Programme in 2014, funded and supported by Rosy Blue Foundation with the prime focus of supporting Project Anando by connecting rural children with urban children, individuals and corporates, thereby bridging the gap between urban and rural India.

Through this programme, both urban and rural youth are provided a platform to explore their own potential – to learn, engage, explore, invent, have fun, make friends, speak out, raise questions, share experiences, gain knowledge and much more. The programme focusses not only on educating the students but inspiring them to become Change Agents by cementing a sustainable support system for Project Anando.

Urban students gained a first-hand exposure to the multiple challenges faced by their rural counterparts, trying to find a solution, planting the seeds of compassion and understanding the logic of giving back to society. They were also pleased by the willingness of their parents to get involved and participate along with their children, creating healthy family bonds. The students also gained a sense of pride and accomplishment, as they successfully set up one of the center in the heart of Mumbai – the Worli center.

Anando beneficiaries were also exposed to a world far different from where they come from and greatly strengthened their knowledge of spoken and written English, Mathematics and Social Studies. However, perhaps the greatest benefit for all the youth – rural and urban – is the pure bond of friendship created by this programme.




Residential Programme 23rd & 24th October 2015

In the months of December 15 & January 16 the NSS Hill Spring International School students helped in setting up the Worli centre by painting and beautifying the premises.


